From Pastor Courtney

When Jesus called the disciples, he invited them into community saying "Come and see" or "Come and join!" When our church began 65 years ago, I tend to think our members were invited into this community in a similar way. Come and see the message of God's love in this place! Come and join this new community that brings people together from near and far to be God's hands and feet in the world!

65 years later we continue to work on how we invite others into this community. I wonder how we can follow the model of Jesus by saying to those around us "come and see" or "come and join!"

Our world and society have moved away from actually engaging with one another. We shy away from the question "How are you?" not wanting to actually share how we are doing because it makes people uncomfortable. We find it easier and faster to make social media posts, announcements and hang sign ups rather than invite one another to "come and see."

I wonder what it would look like to truthfully answer the question "how are you" with an honest response, and to spend time praying together. I wonder how much more engagement and participation we might have if we invite one another to participate in the activities we are excited about. I wonder what our community would look like if we started saying "come and see" or "come and join" to each other.

Two recent examples of this come to mind. We had an amazing turnout at the Community Table hosted by the Ponds Food Pantry in February. It was a great opportunity to meet people in the community and gather around food. I also believe we had such a good turnout because people invited each other to attend the event. It wasn't just a sign or an announcement, but there was a personal invitation behind it. I also think about our ShopRite collection on Super Bowl Sunday. Many volunteers helped to invite people in the community to donate cash or food for the Center for Food Action. The results were incredible – over \$1000 and tons of food. I believe

this event was so successful because we talked to people, invited them to help the community, and thanked them for their consideration whether or not they participated. Come and see. Come and join!

What would it look like to invite friends or neighbors or members of the community to come and join for worship on Sunday or Wednesday, or to participate in our Palm Sunday (3/24) & Easter Sunday (3/31) festivities. That personal ask might mean more to someone than an ad or social media post.

What would it look like to invite friends or neighbors or members of the community to come and join in our Benevolence of the Month projects such as God's Global Barnyard or our collection of baby items for mothers in need? How much more of an impact might we make by talking to people, explaining what we are doing, and inviting them to get involved?

As part of the Discipleship and Witness team for the NJ Synod, I've been exploring what it means to invite people into relationship with God and into community centered on God's love. No matter what books or resources or studies I read, it always comes back to the importance of making that personal invitation or ask. Studies show, people are more likely to come to church or a church event if they're invited by a member than if they're invited by the pastor or see a sign/flyer/social post.

We have had 65 years of ministry here at Messiah. As we look to the next 65 years, I wonder how we might have a stronger community if we focus on asking and inviting people to get involved.

If you made it to the end of this article, then here is your invitation. I invite you to get curious about the ways we can continue to grow our ministry here at Messiah and lay the foundation for many more years of service, faith formation, and community rooted in God's love as we invite others to "Come and See".

Outreach

March BOM: ELCA World Hunger

ELCA World Hunger works to provide immediate relief to those who are hungry, as well as work to meet basic needs and recognize universal human rights to food. They seek to connect people with the resources they need to produce food and grain, access to clean water, education, health care, and sources of income, to create long-term sustainable change.

Part of ELCA World Hunger is the program Good Gifts where you can donate animals and tools that will directly benefit families in need around the world. An animal can make a world of difference for a family in need. Animals provide food to eat, fertilizer to grow crops and offspring to sell at market.

This year we are asking that you prayerfully consider making a commitment or donation towards the purchase of an animal. Our goal as a congregation this year is to raise \$715, which is the cost of a family farm. Individual options range from \$10 for 10 chicks, \$30 for a piglet, and \$50 for a share of a fish farm.

April BOM: First Choice Women's Resource Centers

Founded in 1985, First Choice Women's Resource Centers serve over 5,000 women, babies and students each year. They have resource centers located in Jersey City, Montclair, Morristown, Newark and New Brunswick, and they provide interactive Real Talk sexual education at local schools. They provide free services and education at all stages of life from sexual education, pregnancy, and parenting up to age 18 months old.

Budget Report

To All Members of Messiah Lutheran Church,

Total Income in January was 14.5K versus expenses of \$16.K, resulting in a deficit of 1.5K. Dedicated Accounts decreased \$1.6K in January with a current balance of \$72.5K. There is a net decrease of \$1.6K since January 1st.

Cash Accounts (Checking and Savings) decreased \$3,600, from \$113.7K to \$110.1K in January. There is a net decrease of \$3,600 since January 1st.


