If God is a shepherd, who never stops seeking,


Let us be willing to be found, no matter how lost we feel.

# THE GOSPEL: The Holy Gospel according to Luke 15:1-7 Glory to you, O Lord.






All who are hungry, come! The feast of grace is spread. Amen.


